
#### Methodology

- Telephone survey of the general public
  - 1,004 interviews with a national random sample of Canadians 18 years of age and older
    - ✓ Interview period: September 12 to September 14, 2006
    - ✓ National results valid within 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20
  - The margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided
  - It should also be noted that the refusal rate and other measurement errors could also increase the margin of error
- All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, gender and age composition reflects that of the actual population of Canada according to Census data.


#### Direction of Government/country

**Q:** All things considered, would you say that the ... is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?




#### Direction of Government by region

**Q:** All things considered, would you say that the Government of Canada is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?




#### Tracking direction of Government since the election

**Q:** All things considered, would you say that the Government of Canada is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?




#### Tracking direction of country since the election

**Q:** All things considered, would you say that the country is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?




# Collapse of the housing market?

#### Unprecedented environmental catastrophe?


**Q:** I am really worried that the world is headed for an unprecedented environmental catastrophe within the next decade or so.


## Approval ratings for Stephen Harper

**Q:** Do you approve or disapprove of the way Stephen Harper is handling his job as Prime Minister?




#### Harper seen as meeting expectations

#### Minority status seen as neither a hindrance nor a help in performance


Q: And do you feel their performance would be better, worse or about the same if they held a majority of seats in Parliament?

Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?




Undecided/declined: 9.2% Would/could not vote: 4.6%


#### National federal vote intentions: long-term trend

#### Federal voting intentions: regional


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

#### Quebec federal vote intentions: trend since 2004 election


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

#### Ontario federal vote intentions: trend since 2004 election


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

#### Federal voting intentions: gender and age


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

#### Federal voting intentions: education and income


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

## Liberals second choice among voters


Q: If you were to change your mind, which party would be your second choice?


Q: Which of the following do you think should be the most important issue for the next federal election?


#### Importance of improving Canada-US relations




## Growing isolationism in Canada?

Q: Given our current values and interests, do you think Canada should be...




# Support for Canadian military participation in Afghanistan

#### Reason for opposition to Afghanistan mission (opponents only)


Q: Would you say you oppose Canadian military participation primarily because...

Q: Would you say you support Canadian military participation primarily because...



#### Preference for Quebec's political status


Q: Ideally, which of the following four options would you prefer for Quebec?

## Likelihood of Quebec separation in next 2 years


Q: What is the likelihood that Quebec will separate from the rest of Canada in the next two years?

## Likelihood of Quebec separation in next 5 years


Q: What is the likelihood that Quebec will separate from the rest of Canada in the next five years?

# Tracking likelihood of Quebec separation (Quebec only)


Q: What is the likelihood that Quebec will separate from the rest of Canada in the next ...?
