
# Methodology

- Telephone survey of the general public
  - ❖ 1704 interviews with a national random sample of Canadians 18 years of age and older. This total includes an additional 501 cases collected on May 17, 2005 with a smaller instrument containing questions on vote intention and Belinda Stronach.
    - ✓ Overall interview period: May 13 May 17, 2005
    - ✓ National results valid within 2.4 percentage points, 19 times out of 20
  - The margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided
  - It should also be noted that the refusal rate and other measurement errors could also increase the margin of error
- All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, gender and age composition reflects that of the actual population of Canada according to Census data.

# Satisfaction with direction of country


**Q:** All things considered, would you say the **country** is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?

#### Satisfaction with direction of Government


**Q:** All things considered, would you say the **Government of Canada** is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?

**Q:** All things considered, would you say the **Government of Canada** is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?



# Polarization on majority stability vs. minority leash


Q: Which of the following two statements is closest to your own point of view?

# Desire for formal alliances to ensure stability


**Q:** If no single party has enough voter support to form a majority government, then I would like to see a formal alliance between some of the parties in order to ensure a more stable Parliament.

#### Most prefer to wait, but support for immediate election up



**Q:** Canada should have a fixed date for federal elections every four years.



**Q:** And thinking about...which federal party do you feel offers the best solutions to address it?\*







#### High awareness of Stronach's decision



#### Public highly split regarding Stronach's decision


Q: Overall, do you support or oppose Belinda Stronach's decision to switch parties?

**Q:** Does this move by Belinda Stronach make you more or less likely to vote for the Liberal Party in the next federal election, or does it have no effect on your vote intention?





Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?




# Federal voting intentions: trend since Martin became P.M.

Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?




# Federal voting intentions: long-term trend

Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?




# Quebec federal voting preferences

Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?





Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?







Q: If you were to change your mind, which party would be your second choice?





# Liberals zoom ahead as likely winner of another election


**Q:** Putting aside your personal voting intentions for the next federal election, which party do you think will win?

# Next government thought to be a minority


**Q:** Do you think it will be a minority or a majority government?
