
# Methodology

- Telephone survey of the general public
  - 1031 interviews with a national random sample of Canadians 18 years of age and older
    - ✓ Interview period: September 13 September 19, 2005
    - ✓ National results valid within 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20
  - The margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided
  - It should also be noted that the refusal rate and other measurement errors could also increase the margin of error
- All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, gender and age composition reflects that of the actual population of Canada according to Census data.

# Have Canadians made adjustments because of higher gas prices?


Q: Thinking about you and your family, would you say that you have reduced the amount you drive, or made other adjustments to your daily life, as a result of the recent increase in gas prices?

#### Adjustments made because of higher gas prices


Q: What is the main adjustment that you and your family have made to daily life?

# Gender gap in adjustments made because of higher gas prices


Q: What is the main adjustment that you and your family have made to daily life?

# Government ability to cushion Canadians from higher gas prices


Q: Do you think that governments in Canada have the ability to cushion Canadians from higher gas prices?

# Regional variation on perceived Government ability in this area


Q: Do you think that governments in Canada have the ability to cushion Canadians from higher gas prices?

#### What can governments do?


Q: What is the main thing that governments should do in order to cushion Canadians from higher gas prices?


