




Methodology

- Telephone survey of the general public
 - 1308 interviews with a national random sample of Canadians 18 years of age and older
 - ✓ Interview period: November 28 to December 1, 2005
 - ✓ National results valid within 2.7 percentage points, 19 times out of 20
 - The margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided
 - It should also be noted that the refusal rate and other measurement errors could also increase the margin of error
- All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, gender and age composition reflects that of the actual population of Canada according to Census data.

Direction of Government/country


Q: All things considered, would you say that the ... is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?

Direction of Government/country by region


Q: All things considered, would you say that the ... is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?


Tracking direction of Government

Q: All things considered, would you say that the country is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?



Most important issue


Q: Which of the following do you think should be the most important issue for the next federal election?




Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

Federal vote intentions: long-term trend


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

Federal vote intentions: trend since last election



Quebec federal vote intentions: trend since last election




Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

Federal voting intentions: gender and age


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?




Q: Putting aside your personal voting intentions for the next federal election, which party do you think will win?

Tracking likely winner


Q: Putting aside your personal voting intentions for the next federal election, which party do you think will win?

Q: Putting aside your personal voting intentions for the next federal election, if you had to choose between a Liberal minority and a Conservative minority government, which would you prefer?



Positioning of the Political Parties


CPC most unpalatable to voters; LPC a close second

Opposition to parties by region


Q: Thinking about the main parties running in the coming election, is there any political party that you would definitely not vote for?

Sponsorship main reason voters won't support the Liberals


Q: What is the main reason you would not vote for the Liberal Party of Canada?

Party platform main reason voters won't support the CPC


Q: What is the main reason you would not vote for the Conservative Party of Canada?

Party platform main reason voters won't support the NDP


Q: What is the main reason you would not vote for the New Democratic Party?

Fit to govern


Q: I think the ... is not fit to govern Canada.

Time for a new ruling party in Ottawa


Q: After so many years of Liberal government, I really think the country needs a new ruling party in Ottawa.

Q: After so many years of Liberal government, I really think the country needs a new ruling party in Ottawa.




Vision for the future

Best vision by region


Q: Which of the following leaders is doing the best job of articulating a positive vision for the future?


Trust in leaders
