Contradictory Signals from an Uncertain Public




Methodology

- Telephone survey of the general public
 - 1,326 interviews with a national random sample of Canadians 18 years of age and older
 - ✓ Interview period: April 26-28,2004
 - ✓ National results valid within 2.7 percentage points, 19 times out of 20
 - The margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided
 - It should also be noted that the refusal rate and other measurement errors could also increase the margin of error
- All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, gender and age composition reflects that of the actual population of Canada according to Census data.

Satisfaction with direction of government


Q: All things considered, would you say the **Government of Canada** is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?

Significant regional variation in satisfaction with direction of government


Q: All things considered, would you say the **Government of Canada** is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?

Satisfaction with direction of country


Q: All things considered, would you say the **country** is moving in the right direction or the wrong direction?

Satisfaction with direction of country by region



Economic confidence over the short-term


Q: Thinking ahead over the next **year** or so, do you think your personal financial situation will be better or worse than it is today?

Q: Thinking ahead over the next **five years** or so, do you think your personal financial situation will be better or worse than it is today?



The Sponsorship Scandal


Sponsorship controversy registering with voters

Q: Do you recall hearing or seeing anything about the recent controversy over the federal government's sponsorship program?




Public views scandal as typical of government problems, however, lean is definitely to "worse"

Public mildly comforted by sharing of information



Q: Please rate the extent to which you agree or disagree with each of the following statement.


I'm so disturbed by problems with ethics and accountability that I simply won't vote for the Liberals in the next election





Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?




Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

Federal voting intentions: regional


Q: If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?*

NDP and CPC tied for second choice


Q: If you were to change your mind, which party would be your second choice?



Undecided/declined:13% Will not vote/change mind: 11%


Most say Liberals will win next election

Next government thought to be a minority


Q: Do you think it will be a minority or a majority government?
