

## Mid-term poll – International Results

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#### Methodology

- The polls were conducted in the four participating countries at the end of October 2006. Telephone surveys of a representative sample of approximately 1,000 residents were conducted in each country. A sample of this size produces a statistical margin of error of +/- 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's composition reflects that of the actual population from which it was drawn.
- Methodological details for each country are shown in the table below:
