
Methodology

Telephone surveys of the general public

- October 2-3, 2002: 1,026 completed interviews with a national random sample of Canadians 18 years of age and over (n=201 in Alberta); National results valid within +/- 3.1 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (Alberta: <u>+</u> 6.9%)
- 2) May 27-29, 2002: 1,217 completed interviews with a national random sample of Canadians 18 years of age and over (n=362 in Quebec); National results valid within +/- 2.8 percentage points, 19 times out of 20 (Quebec: <u>+</u> 5.2%)
 - ✓ The margin of error increases when the results are sub-divided.
 - ✓ It should also be noted that the refusal rate and other measurement errors could also increase the margin of error.
- All the data were statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, gender and age composition reflects that of the actual population of Canada according to Census data


Kyoto – Chrétien vs. Klein

Q: Who is more likely to tell a child the truth about the environmental future of the planet, Ralph Klein or Jean Chrétien?




Kyoto – Alberta/RoC Polarization

Kyoto – East/West Fracture?


Q: Who is more likely to tell a child the truth about the environmental future of the planet, Ralph Klein or Jean Chrétien? (Do not know/no response not displayed)
