#### Medium-term financial outlook



#### Generational outlook & social class

- Fears are highest when turned to the future
- The grey outlook on the present turns almost black as the public ponder the fate of future generations
- The apparent 'end of progress' may be relaxing its hold


#### **Generational Outlook**

optimistic middle class


**Proposition 2:** AND IF the middle class is neither growing nor optimistic


**Implication:** THEN societal health and economic progress will be in peril if


these negative conditions persist

**Q.** Overall, which of the following choices do you believe best describes Canada's middle class?







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
## Views on the rise of populism


#### Ingredients of open-ordered index

■ Ordered (5-6)




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## Why values?

- » Ultimate yardsticks of societal preference; normative indicators of right/wrong, good/bad
  - Glacial, not mercurial
- » No monolithic consensus possible in increasingly pluralistic society
- » Long-term trends showing some profound declines in traditional values (traditional family values, respect for authority, minimal government, etc.)

Q. If you were to direct the federal government as to which goals or values should be most important in shaping its direction, how important would you say each of the following goals or values should be?




#### Changes in identity

- » National attachment has remained high in Canada<sup>(1)</sup>
- » Importantly, identification with ethnic group declined profoundly over the last 20 years
- Despite warnings about 'selling illusions' and ethnic enclaves, it appears the reverse is true (more recently: Maxime Bernier)

Q. How strong is your own personal sense of belonging to...






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#### Attitudes to immigration/minorities (adjusted)


IVR. To compensate for this distortion, we have adjusted the pre-2009 results by 13 points.



Q. Please rate the extent to which you agree or disagree with the following statement: There should be free trade between the U.S., Canada and Mexico






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## Most important issue by party support

**Q.** Of the following issues, which one do you think should be the most important issue for the next federal election?



#### Ontario vote behaviour


Q. How did you vote in this election?



#### A net 22-point erosion of male Liberal vote


**Q.** If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?



# A net 19-point erosion of non-university Liberal support


**Q.** If a federal election were held tomorrow, which party would you vote for?

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## Conclusions (i)

- » A new variant of populism orderedpopulism – has taken root in Canada and other countries
- » In order to confront this force, it is important to understand its roots
  - Brought about by "end of progress", fears of a more dangerous world
  - Mutated into cultural factors (insecurities about loss of privilege, nativism, xenophobia, racial intolerance)

## Conclusions (ii)

- » Fundamental shifts in fault lines underpinning political choices
  - Oscillations across promiscuous progressive voters transformed into defection to ordered-populist camp
  - Huge fault lines have opened up along social class, education, and gender
- Yet overall attitudinal shifts suggest Canada is pivoting open
- There are now two Canadas
  - Huge gaps on fundamental choices for the future (e.g., climate change, social issues, immigration)

## Conclusions (iii)

- » It is clear that these forces were initiated by economic and class changes
- Treating the symptoms is unlikely to make things better
- » Collapse of middle-class bargain needs focus (not cultural symptoms of that failure)
- » Note boldness of measures that propelling era of middle class progress following Great Depression
  - Where is our new deal for the 21st century?
- » Will Laurier's dream for Canada come one century late?
