
HIGHLIGHTS:

- Poll of 1,764 Quebec residents, field dates Aug. 31-Sept. 2, 2012; margin of error is +/- 2.3% 19 times out of 20
- PQ showing a significant lead, close or in majority territory
- PLQ have stumbled badly, no chance of forming government
- Testing "commitment" (linked to turnout)
 - overall PQ most committed
 - OS and CAQ less committed
 - PLQ low enthusiasm but otherwise likely voters
- Sovereignty options outstrip federalist options by significant margin (particularly amongst PQ and OS voters)
 - Support for status quo lowest ever
- Combination of PQ majority and majority leaning for sovereignty has profound, uncertain implications


